

The IGNITE program is an academic and social enrichment program incorporating system-wide students into the general education curriculum.

Schedule/List of Courses

- Students attend General Education classes based off of their individual academic and social aptitude on a rotating semester schedule
- A total of 15 students and 10 student mentors participated in the program in the Spring 2017 semester

Role of Exceptional Ed Staff

- Oversee development and implementation of the program
- Create master schedule aligning with Student Mentors' schedules
- Responsible for modifying general education curriculum to meet the needs of individual students
- Responsible for student mentor selection and their daily responsibilities

- Provide classroom support for students, mentors, and General Education Teachers
- Provide training for General Education teachers and student mentors
- Accountable for student mentors Work Based Learning Personalized Learning Plan
- Align student schedules and curriculum with IEP goals and services

Role of the General Ed Staff

- Provide curriculum map and state standards to Ex-Ed Staff for modifications
- Discuss IGNITE Program with their class at the beginning of the semester

- Collaborate with Student mentors and Ex Ed staff regarding student progress
- Collaborate with Ex Ed staff on student mentors performance

IGNITE Student Mentors

- General education students are selected to be peer mentors providing classroom support for the IGNITE students
- The mentor selection process involves an application process, teacher recommendations, and a formal interview with IGNITE staff
- Mentors receive regular ED credit through Work Based Learning each semester earning up to four credits

- Mentors are trained by IGNITE staff during the initial process with students before going into General Ed classes
- Mentors accompany students to class and provide assistance with daily activities inside the General Ed classroom
- Mentors collaborate with General Ed teachers on daily academic needs

IEP Goals/Services

- IEP goals and services guide class selection
- Goals and services are typically updated on a semester basis

 Due to alignment of IEP goals and class selection, data collection and progress monitoring tools are readily available

Organization Skills

- Important key to success
- Student creates individualized organization system for each specific class

- Be prepared when class starts, so no important information is missed
- PLANNERS are a must for success

Focus/Study Skills

- Triggers for distractions
- Keys to eliminating procrastination
- Note taking skills

- Develop good study skills for school/home
- Develop good test taking skills

IGNITE PROGRAM TIMELINE

Dec 2015-Jan 2016: Researched the following University: EDGE (Union Univ.), FUTURE (UT), IDEAL (Lipscomb), and **NEXT STEPS** (Vanderbilt)

Feb 2016: Developed plan for Mentor scheduling and credit bearing courses. Developed plan for student schedules.

April 2016:


Mentor application screenings, teacher recommendation, interviews. Discussed program with General Ed. teachers that would be good candidates for Fall pilot program.

Aug 2016:

Finalized class blocks being used based of of Gen. Ed. teacher selection and Mentors schedules. Training with teachers and student mentors began. Student/Mentor orientation and students began going to classes.

Nov 2016:

Begin Application process for new mentors for Spring 2017



Jan 2016: Developed major themes of the programs and shared with Administration for approval.

March 2016:

Began application process for mentors: 10th grade advisories for applicants

May 2016: Finalized Mentor selections and their schedules for Fall pilot program

Oct 2016:

Survey's completed by students, mentors, General Ed teachers, and parents to see what areas need to be adjusted.

Dec 2016: Finalize mentor selections and class selections for Spring 2017
